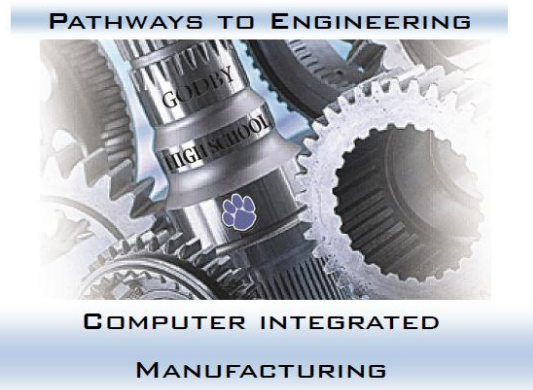

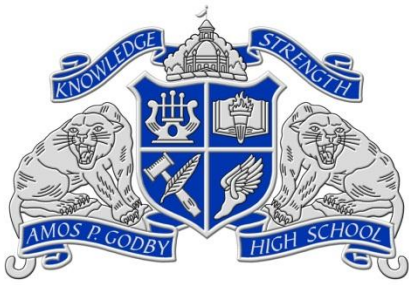

CAREER ACADEMIES

Academy of Finance:

The Academy of Finance provides hands-on experience, allowing students a unique opportunity for learning numerous aspects of finance. Students can take advantage of honors-weighted and advanced placement courses. Students receive a rigorous and relevant curriculum for achieving success in high school and prepare for specific jobs throughout the financial industry. The Academy of Finance students at Godby High School take part in a unique experience that is made possible through our partnership with the United Way of the Big Bend and our local IRS. Godby's finance students are trained and certified by the IRS to prepare federal income tax returns for members of our community free of charge. This service allows our students real-life experience and exposes them to the realities of our economy. In addition, these students experience the great satisfaction of helping others in need. Students also have opportunities for other internships in the field of finance and have the opportunity to earn industry-level certifications.

Academy of Information Technology:

The Academy of Information Technology (AOIT) offers an honors-weighted and advanced placement integrated program, linking the core academic subjects to information technology and computer content. The AOIT combines college preparatory curriculum with an information technology career oriented study track. The program also prepares students to test for numerous industry certifications while still in high school. When students graduate from the AOIT program, they are prepared to enter both the traditional four-year university and join the work force. Pathways to Engineering – Academy of Computer Integrated Manufacturing:

The mission of the Pathways to Engineering program is to provide students with a foundation of knowledge and experiences in the study of the applications of engineering and its effect upon society. To accomplish this goal, a curriculum driven by students engaging in hands-on projects with a focus on the fundamental concepts of engineering design analysis, robotics and the production processes and systems used in the advanced manufacturing industry. Students who graduate from the program earn college credit and nationally recognized certifications that prepare them to enter both an institution of higher learning and the work force.
