

Magnet Probation Letter Questions & Answers:

Q: What do I do first?

A: Parents and students should read over the form and sign at the bottom of the form.

Q: Where does the signed form go?

A: Stapled inside the student's agenda until the form has been completed: signed by you, your parent, and all teacher(s) after each help session attended.

Q: How do I make an appointment with teachers?

A: See them either before or after class **OR** before or after school to set up time(s) to meet.

Q: Do I have to find out what days the teacher has help sessions and show up for one?

A: No, please meet individually with each teacher to make an appointment outside of normal help sessions.

Q: What if I only have behavior for one class, do I have to meet with ALL teachers?

A: No, only the teacher who's class you have the behavior form for.

Q: What if I only have an attendance letter? Do I have to meet with teachers?

A: No, this is a notice that students are expected to attend school regularly so have parents & student sign and return to Mrs. Bowen or Mrs. Curry.

Q: What do I do with my completed form?

A: 6th graders return completed forms to Mrs. Bowen.

A: 7th graders return completed forms to Mrs. Curry.

Q: What is a 'completed form'?

A: A completed form is a form signed by the student, parent and teacher(s) indicating the dates that you met with your teacher(s). Be sure to meet the required number of times.

Q: Will I be kicked out of the magnet program and out of the school if reassignment is a factor?

A: We will give you a chance to bring up your grades and improve behavior so you should not be kicked out.

** If behavior does not improve your reassignment status can be revoked. If your academics do not improve you can be taken out of the magnet program but your reassignment status should not change.

Q: Can behavior or grades keep me from attending magnet events and field trips?

A: Yes.

Q: What do I do if I lose my form? Especially if it has teachers signatures on it?

A: If it is stapled to the agenda book it should be safe; however, Mrs. Curry in room 2 has a copy. If you already have teachers' signatures on it then you will have to return to those teachers to get it signed again. You may not have to meet again if the teacher has a sign-in list to prove you have already been there.

While a report card shows the areas that need improvement this form is a tool for students to use so they can take ownership of their progress, to meet with teachers, and use available resources to help them make better grades and/or maintain better behavior.
