
John Urbach will go on to represent Cobb in the Leon County Spelling Bee at Leon High School on Tuesday, January 12th. Congratulations, John!

classrooms in the seventh grade. In Mrs. Davis's math classes, they have been preparing for midterms, focusing heavily on solving proportions. They are beginning to


Eighth Grade


