Attendance

Florida law requires each parent of a child from five to sixteen years of age to be responsible for the child's school attendance. Florida Statutes, 1003.24 defines the responsibility of parents for the attendance of their child at school and requires them to provide an explanation for any absence from school.

EXCUSED AND UNEXCUSED ABSENCES

It is the parent/guardian responsibility to notify the school regarding the reason for a student's absence in a timely fashion.

The law allows absences for illness or medical care, death in the family, religious holidays, **prearranged absences** for educational purposes approved by an administrator, financial and certain other special circumstances or insurmountable conditions.

Unexcused absenteeism sufficient enough to jeopardize academic progress at the elementary and middle school levels is defined as a student being absent without an acceptable reason **five** (5) times in a calendar month or **ten** (10) times in a 90-calendar day period.

TARDINESS

Tardiness is any arrival at school after the tardy bell **(8:30)** has sounded without an approved excuse. Likewise, students who leave school before the end of the school day **(2:50)** have their learning interrupted.

Tardiness and leaving early without an acceptable excuse are seen as a form of nonattendance, which is in violation of compulsory attendance statutes.
