#### **Pre-K News**

We are having a BLAST in Pre-K so far this year!!! We have spent the month in our Trees Study. We have investigated topics such as: what comes from a tree, which is bigger, what are the characteristics of trees, who lives in trees and what food comes from trees. We have made predictions, about which tree has the largest circumference, is the tree bigger or smaller than you, and how does a tree feel. We have measured the circumference of trees. We learned new vocabulary words, such as circumference, heavier, lighter, lean, stretch, smaller and bigger.

We have enjoyed many stories, such as *Abiyoyo*, *Chicka Chicka Boom Boom*, *The Grouchy Ladybug* and *Henny Penny*.

The children have settled into all the rules and routines of the class-room and school and their learning progression shows that. Keep an eye out for information about end of the nine weeks conferences.

One of our main goals is to help your child become more independent and gain confidence. As cooler weather approaches, they have an opportunity to practice independence with their jacket. #### 4th Grade

The fourth-grade classes just finished multiplication strategies for 2 digit x 2 digit and are moving into division. In this unit we have learned about biographies and nonfiction text. The classes have been working with main idea, details, sequence and context clues. We have improved our writing skills by fixing sentences and adding in missing details or information. Keep studying those definitions and spelling words weekly. They are tested on spelling words weekly, and vocabulary words are tested on their assessment.
