Squash, Squash, and More Squash!

As you begin planning your next holiday meal, consider squash! Butternut, acorn, kabocha, spaghetti, pumpkin...there's a winter squash for every occasion. These delicious veggies are loaded with nutrients, including about a dozen carotenoids (plant chemicals that the body converts to vitamin A), along with B vitamins, vitamin C, and minerals. Though high in carbohydrates, they're full of fiber and help to steady your blood sugar after a meal. Try butternut squash soup, roasted acorn or kabocha squash, and spaghetti squash "noodles" with your favorite sauce.





# **Pre-K News**

Farewell Dear Trees! Hello Bright Balls! As the days continue to fly by, we look back on all the wonderful things we have learned about the world around us. In pre-k, we completed the study of trees in our environment! When using our five senses, we observed and investigated questions such as: "What food comes from trees?", "Who takes care of trees?", and "How do trees change?" The children collected various tree parts (branches, sticks, leaves, acorns, pinecones) and integrated them into our learning. For example, the students used tree parts such as acorns, sticks and twigs to measure the length and height of objects, created patterns (acorn, leaf, acorn, leaf, acorn, leaf, etc.), and much more. Throughout our investigations, the children learned the importance of trees and caring for the world around us.

As we begin the final month of the year, we will start the ball study! We are excited to navigate this new adventure. We are so proud of the children!

#### 1st Grade

It is so hard to believe that we have made it halfway through the school year! First graders are showing significant reading growth according to their online STAR Early Literacy tests. We will also take the online STAR Reading test this month, which can be more of a struggle for first graders when they take it the first time. Make sure to read with your child, or listen to your child read, every night in addition to the regular weekly homework.

In math, we are beginning chapter 6, which is *Count and Model Numbers*. This is a great time to work on skip counting skills! During car rides, you can practice counting to 120 by 5s or 10s.

Since the weather is cooling down, please make sure your child has a jacket with them at school. On days that the temperatures drop below 44 degrees, we will not be playing outside. If your child has asthma or any other conditions that are affected by the cooler weather, please let your teacher know.

In addition, please ensure that students have jackets in their backpacks and an extra set of clothes in a ziplock or grocery bag so that all the clothes are contained together .
