#### \*Kindergarten News

Hello kindergarten families!

We are moving right along in kindergarten to get ready for first grade.

ELA- Students are working on Unit 3 with new letters and sight words each week. Please continue to work on these letters and sight words.

Letters: Jj, Xx, short u, Vv, Zz, Qq, short A and long A, Short i and long i.

Sight words: was, said, where, any, come, play, her, how, down, away, give, little, were, some, funny, going, know, live

Math- In Math students are on Chapter 5 learning about addition and what the plus symbol means. We have begun reading math sentences to make a greater number. In Chapter 6, students will learn about subtraction and what the minus symbol represents.

Science & Social Studies- Students will learn about the different kinds of plants and their life cycle. Students will learn about Ground Hog Day (Feb 2), the important people throughout Black History Month (February).

#### First Grade News

First graders are working hard and making lots of growth in their confidence and willingness to read on grade level stories and writings. In reading we are also continuing to work on our grade level sight words and learning to create correctly formed sentences. Our students took STAR Reading for the first time as we prepare for FAST number three which is quickly approaching. In math our students are learning how to use models and hundreds of charts to add and subtract two-digit numbers. In Science we are finishing up about Matter and beginning a chapter about motion and objects in motion. We are learning all about maps and the parts of maps in Social Studies and will soon be working to design a map of our own that we could share with a friend. Lots of big things happening down in first grade to kick off 2023!

#### \*Second Grade News

Second Grade Families.

Second grade has already been hard at work towards meeting our goals for the third 9 weeks of school. In Language Arts, we are working on reading independently, answering comprehension questions (who/what/when/where/why/how), and being "Text Detectives" by looking back in the text to find key details that support the central idea! When reading at home, don't forget to ask your child questions about what they read! The **AR Goal** this 9 weeks is **10 points!** Be sure to read with your student at home every day!

In Math, we are learning about different strategies for 3-digit addition and subtraction, before moving on to strategies on telling time and counting money. Please be sure to practice math facts for addition and subtraction to increase math fact fluency!

In Science, we are learning about changing states of matter and energy. Be ready to talk to your student about solids, liquids, and gases and/or how heat, light, and sound create energy!

In Social Studies, we will be learning about important, historical figures and inventors during Black History Month. Don't forget to read with your child each night – it makes a HUGE difference in your child's academic success!

#### Third Grade News

I can't believe that we have already made it to the halfway mark in Third Grade! Students are so enthused about what the rest of the school year will bring! Currently, in Reading/ELA the students are learning about "Heroes" and "Historical Fictions" in Unit 3 of Savvas. In Math, students really enjoyed and did great on multiplication and have been practicing strategies and methods for division! In Science, we are learning about the "Forms of Energy" and how light moves and reflects. In Social Studies, we are learning about the contributions to the American Culture by African Americans. Other exciting news: Third Grade is having their very first in-house field trip, Friday, February 3, 2023. Animal Tales (The Animal Science Program) will be visiting Fort Braden School to introduce and explore the topic of animal classifications. Students will meet and learn about a member of each of the following animal types: bird, reptile, amphibian, mammal, invertebrate and maybe even a fish!

In Math, we are working on decimal multiplication and learning how to estimate decimal products.

#### Middle School Math

6<sup>th</sup> grade math – Writing Algebraic Expressions

7<sup>th</sup> Grade math – Area of Parallelograms/Trapezoids/Rhombus

#### Middle School Social Studies

8<sup>th</sup> Grade US History started the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester with our 2<sup>nd</sup> president! They have been focusing on the tensions between two of our most important Founding Fathers, Thomas Jefferson and John Adams, and their thoughts on how our government should be run. 8<sup>th</sup> Grade has also been studying the Civil Rights movement of the 1950s and '60s in honor of Martin Luther King Jr's birthday, focusing on the amendments created directly after the Civil War.

7<sup>th</sup> Grade Civics students have been analyzing the functions and roles of the legislative branch of the federal government, including how a bill becomes a law, and will begin their study of the federal executive branch next.

6<sup>th</sup> Grade World History students have been learning all about Imperial China- the various dynasties of the period, social and political developments, philosophies, and the geography of the area.

#### Middle School Science

Hello all! Mr. Martin and Mrs. Williams here from the Science department in middle school!

6<sup>th</sup> grade science: Feb will be working on weather versus climate and learning about dangerous weather! With that also comes tips for staying safe/preparedness.

7<sup>th</sup> grade science: Feb Human Impacts on the environment and moving into genes and heredity with some fun and interesting activities. Students may learn how they and their siblings have different colored hair from each other/their parents!

#### Middle School ELA

Ms. Hatcher's ELA 7 classes are reading the novel <u>Call It Courage</u> by Armstrong Sperry. This novel is rich in vocabulary and figurative language which makes it not only enjoyable but great preparation for our FAST 3 test coming the end of April. Students should also be reading 20 minutes nightly in their AR books to work toward making their AR goal and to fulfill homework requirements.

Eighth graders are investigating why we take chances through the lens of writers such as Frederick Douglass, Anya Groner, and Jack London. After completing our readings for the unit, students will engage

in an expository extended writing project where they will identify and analyze the risks the authors, speakers and/or characters took in their lifetimes.

Reading Intervention: We have started our Language Live program and students are working hard to improve their reading skills. Please have your student read or be read to for 20 minutes per night.

#### Band

Joseph Watson, one of our 7<sup>th</sup> grade Advanced Band musicians is preparing a piece for trumpet and piano. He will play his piece with an accompanist for Solo and Ensemble on either February 17<sup>th</sup> or 18<sup>th</sup> at Swift Creek Middle School. Best of luck to Joseph!

The Advanced Band is working hard to prepare three pieces for Concert MPA (Music Performance Assessment), which will be happening at Leon High School on March 4<sup>th</sup> at 1:30. Parents are welcome to attend this event.
