NEW VERBIAGE from Office of Student Financial Aid (OSFA) and Bright Futures:

Students must complete a program of volunteer service <u>or</u>, <u>beginning with a high school students graduating in the 2022-2023 academic year and thereafter, paid work</u>, as approved by the district school board, the administrators of a nonpublic school. Each district school board and the administrators of a nonpublic school must establish approved activities and the process for documentation of volunteer service or paid work hours including the deadline by which they must be completed.

Students must earn either the required volunteer service **OR** paid work hours, but not a combination of both.

The student <u>may</u> identify a social or civic issue or a professional area that interests them and develop a plan for their personal involvement in addressing the issue or learning about the area. The student must, through papers or other presentations, evaluate and reflect upon their volunteer service or paid work experience.

Such volunteer service or paid work may include, but is not limited to, a business or governmental internship, work for a nonprofit community service organization, or activities on behalf of a candidate for public office.

The hours of volunteer service or paid work must be documented in writing, and the document must be signed by the student, the student's parent or guardian, and a representative of the organization for which the student performed the volunteer service or paid work.
