Principal's Corner




Dear Parents,

What a great first year here at KLES! Thank you everybody for all the support!


In the mid-1880s Paris, Georges Seurat and Paul Signa developed a revolutionary painting technique called Pointillism. Pointillism involves the application of paint in carefully placed dots of pure, unmixed color. The viewer's eye would blend the colors together to create a more striking image than any made after mixing colors conventionally on a palette. Kindergarten and First grade are learning about Bird's Nests. Second grade students are impressionists, making still life paintings of flowers in a pot. Third grade is learning about printmaking with Jasper John. Fourth grade students are creating portraits like Rembrandt, and Fifth grade students are experimenting with robots to create abstract compositions like Wassily Kandinsky. Look for some master pieces to come home soon!
