## Please note the following about orchestra:

- \* Orchestra meets Tuesdays and Thursdays during special-area time. Students will not be penalized for missing Art/Music/PE/Media classes. Grades for those classes may be left blank.
  - \* Leon County Schools graciously funds the instructional portion of the orchestra class.
- \* Students may choose to play violin, viola, or cello. Students must bring their own instruments & orchestra supplies to school with them on orchestra days & carry their instruments/supplies home at the end of the day.
- \* Consistent practice is essential to progressing at learning to play an instrument. Students who enroll in this course are committing to 15-20 minutes of daily at-home practice. Parents/guardians are expected to play a supportive role in this area.
- \* While it does require commitment & perseverance, playing an instrument is fun and rewarding!
- \* This class is an introductory-level program for students who have not played the violin, viola, or cello in the past, or who have limited experience. Please note that this class must by nature start "at the beginning." Any more-advanced



students seeking to join must be willing to join in from the beginning & to maintain a positive & supportive attitude.
