6TH GRADE

Next up is Time Warp, with several days being spent in class to review directions/expectations, how to cite in MLA format, and write our speech. The actual Time Warp (where students dress up as someone involved in their history fair topic) will be on Tuesday, November 14th. Other than that, we are finishing up Egypt and then we are off to Ancient India for our next unit.

6TH GRADE

<u>Mrs. Cameron - Earth Space Science</u>- we are working on our Solar System unit. Students have a Solar System Object Project due on Nov. 7th. Afterwards, we will have our final space unit on Stars. Keep looking up at these majestic objects! Several planets are visible in the night sky.

Ms. Kirkendoll - Language arts - The fall and winter months bring on a lot of activities. This nine-weeks we will be participating in the Tropicana Speech Contest and the Spelling Bee. In addition, we have started our first novel study, and the story is one that helps us to understand gratitude. This time of year is always special, but the novel that I have chosen shows that not everyone has the advantages that we have here in America. The students are ready for all the hard work that this semester brings and the exciting things that are going to be learned. 7TH GRADE

<u>Ms. Thompson- Civics -</u> It has been a great year so far and we are moving through our Civics content in preparation for our midterm exam in December. We are finishing our Unit on the Constitution before moving into The Amendments and ending the 9 weeks with the Legislative branch. <u>Ms. Camen - Language Arts</u> -We are currently working with Unit 2 that has an overarching theme of love and loss. The unit has several different poems that we have been working with. Your students will be composing sonnets of their own soon, keep an eye out! We also have been continuing our Latin Work Chunk exploration to help us figure out the meanings of unknown words.

<u>Mr. Fletcher - Physical Science -</u> he month of November is upon us and Mr. Fletcher's Physical Science class has some fun activities coming up! As the weather starts to cool off, we will be staying warm by learning about thermal energy. We will also begin learning about electricity, and with that, we will be building some simple circuits in class. Students should be conducting experiments at home for their science fair projects as the December 4th due date for their projects gets closer.

<u>Ms. Barraza - Algebra/Algebra Foundations</u> Algebra Foundations has been focusing on 7th grade standards. We are wrapping up our unit on proportional relationships and then moving on to solving percent problems.

Algebra 1 is wrapping up the unit on linear inequalities and will have their unit test on Monday November 6th. The next topic we will cover is Unit 6: Systems of Linear Equations and Inequalities.

8TH GRADE

<u>Mr. Dombek–U.S. History–</u> As we turn the calendar to November, we are moving right along in our US History curriculum, starting next week we will be turning our attention to the formation of the new nation, the Articles of Confederation, Shay's Rebellion, Federalist v Anti–Federalists and the creation of the Constitution. During this month we will also continue to work on our History Fair Project, Time Warp Speeches and beginning our Process Papers. Mr. Lingo, our awesome intern from FAMU will be finishing out his internship on November 17th to prepare for graduation at the beginning of December. Mr. Lingo has been a great addition to our classroom, and we will miss him when he is gone.

<u>Ms. Adams -Language Arts-</u> In the month of October, our 8th graders will be applying their knowledge of rhetorical appeals and devices to their own argumentative speech that will be presented in class. The content of this speech will be inspired by an excerpt from "The Rights of the Colonists" by Samuel Adams.

<u>Dr. Morris - Biology Honors -</u> We are rounding up lessons and activities on biological molecules. Students have learned about the structures and functions of these large molecules and have also explored how indicators can be used to detect the presence of macromolecules in the common foods we eat. In November, we will be learning about cells, their structures and functions, and the processes that go on inside of them. Students will explore cell structures by building a labeled 3D cell of either a plant, animal, or bacteria cell (their choice). Please be on the lookout for project information letters coming home.

<u>Mr. Johnson - Geometry/PreAlgebra</u> -Geometry Will be working Transformations and Symmetry, so Reflection, Rotations, Translations, and Symmetry are Major topics this chapter. Would tell students to look back through notes and information on these subjects.

Pre Algebra will be working Linear Relationships & Slope. Some major chapters for them are Linear Relationships, Slope of a line, Similar Triangles and Slope, and Interpreting Linear Relationships. I would tell students to practice working 2 step equations to help.


LATIN
